The Montana tribes and the headquarters of their reservations are listed below.

Blackfeet, <i>Browning, MT</i>	1851	Blackfeet
Crow, <i>Crow Agency, MT</i>	1851	Crow
Flathead, <i>Pablo, MT</i>	1855	Confederated Salish and Kootenai (and Pend d'Oreille)
Fort Belknap, <i>Fort Belknap Agency, Harlem, MT</i>	1888	Assiniboine and Gros Ventre
Fort Peck, <i>Poplar, MT</i>	1888	Assiniboine and Sioux
Northern Cheyenne, <i>Lame Deer, MT</i>	1884	Northern Cheyenne
Rocky Boy's, <i>Rocky Boy, MT</i>	1916	Chippewa/Cree

Note: The Little Shell Band of Chippewa-Cree has not received federal recognition.
